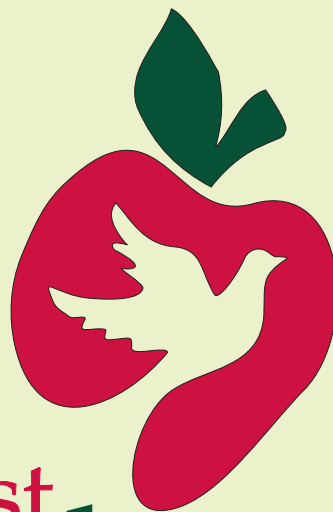

Our Mission Statement

The Corinth Adventist School primarily exists to touch the lives of our children for Jesus. Every student entrusted to our care is a gift of God to be educated for both now and eternity. It is our intentional approach to harmoniously blend the work of redemption and education as one ministry through Christ-centered curriculum.

Goals

The Corinth Adventist School is an extension of the church and the home. Its purpose is to be a partner in the awesome work of training “up a child in the way he should go:”

Every human being, created in the image of God is endowed with a power akin to that of the Creator-- individuality, the power to think and to do. The men in whom this power is developed are the men who bear responsibilities, who are leaders in enterprise, and who influence character. To accomplish this training, you child needs a well-rounded curriculum. This includes Bible study, reading, writing, arithmetic, language, history, geography, health science, art, music, and other helpful subjects.

Students

Students will not be discriminated against on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, or religion.

The student must be six years old by August 15 of the school year.

Health

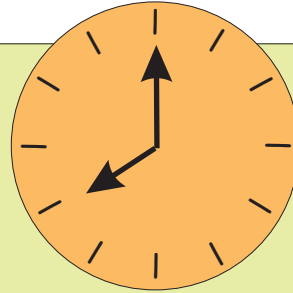
Physicals are required:

For New students

Upon entering grades 4 and 7

If a student has medical needs, please inform the teacher at enrollment. The teacher, in accordance with physician instructions, can administer medicines.

In accordance with teaching your child responsibility, consistent on-time attendance is important.

The school accepts responsibility for your child up to 15 minutes before school starts and 15 minutes after school dismisses. Exceptions must be worked out with the teacher in advance.

If your child will be absent:

- Make arrangements in advance
- Help your child with homework
- For unexpected events, call the school by 10:00 a.m.

Should a child accumulate five (5) unexcused absences, these absences are to be reported to:

- The county school attendance officer
- The school board

Excused Absences are defined as:

- Authorized school activities
- Death or serious illness of immediate family - parent, grandparent, siblings
- Religious events
- Medical/dental appointments
- Educational travel which can include vacation or family travel
- Court proceedings where the child is party to the action
- At the discretion of the teacher



Parents

Please assist the teacher to as your child learns to respect God, friends, classmates, government and the church.

Items to be left at home:

- Knives, guns, matches, fireworks, etc
- Radios, video games, mobile music devices
- Toys, skateboards, etc.

Cell phones may only be used after hours.

If problems arise, please discuss them with the teacher instead of your child. If a problem is not resolved, please bring it to the school board. We want to work together in a spirit that glorifies God and brings unity.

Uniforms

School uniforms create an atmosphere that puts the emphasis on school work and self-discipline while promoting school spirit and Christian love to other students.

Tops: Light Blue or Red

Short-sleeve to be Polo shirts

Long-sleeve to complement your slacks

Slacks, Skirts, Jumpers: Dark Navy or Khaki

Skirts to fall below the knee

Pants to be slacks (not cargo or jeans)

Girls can wear navy shorts under skirts, as long as they are not visible

Socks or Tights: Navy or coordinating

Shoes: Black or White

Shoes are to be active/athletic wear

Sweater & Pullovers: Dark Navy

No wording on sweaters or jackets

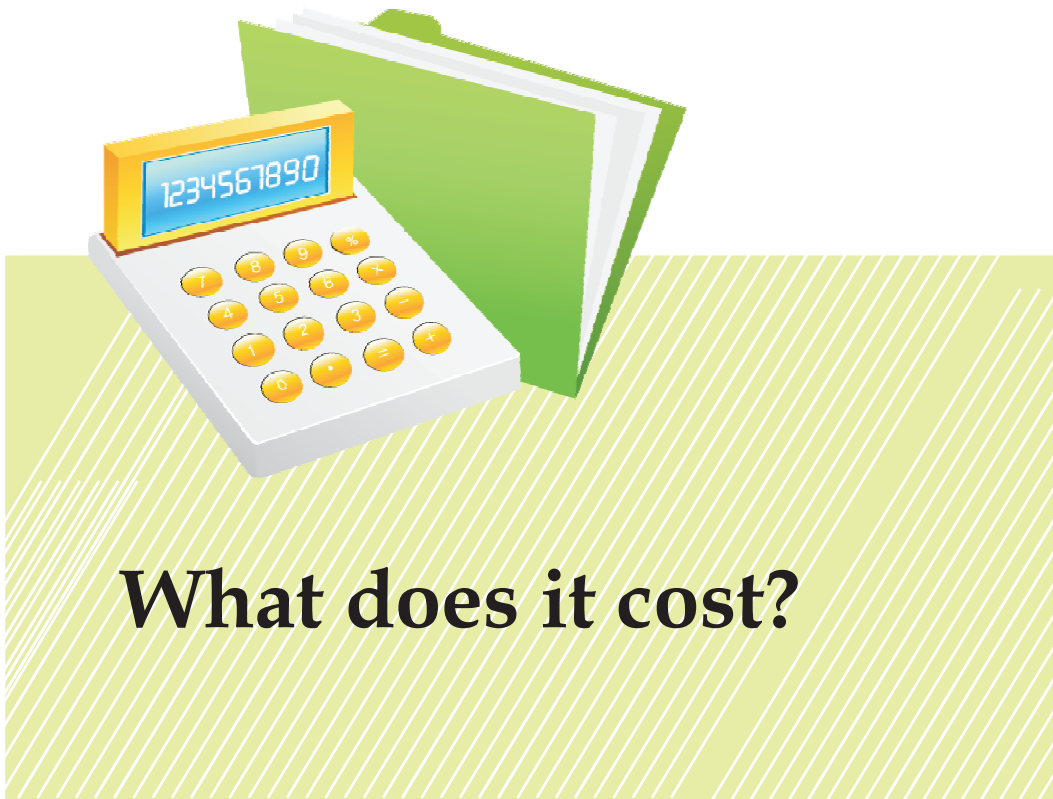

Registration Fee - covers book, insurance, etc. \$200.00
\$50 discount if received by July 15th

Tuition -
